The Arts Management program is designed to provide the knowledge and skills necessary for immediate employment upon completion of the two-year degree. For students wishing to further their education at a four-year institution, this course offers the pathway and foundation courses to do so.

Program Overview and Opportunities:

The Arts Management program provides individuals a strong management curriculum and prepares them to work in the arts and entertainment industry, organizing and promoting the arts and events and managing facilities and budgetary needs. It also prepares students to continue their education toward a baccalaureate degree. Individuals follow a shared managerial core of courses with optional tracks in the Arts.

Arts Management curriculum includes event planning, marketing and advertising, business management, and employee supervision. Depending on the area of emphasis, students would follow a shared core with optional tracks in the Arts.
