### Program Overview

The Global Studies Honors program is a one-year, focused academic initiative (with a two-year option) targeted toward high-achieving high school students whose intentions are to pursue a four-year degree. This initiative will provide these students with the opportunity to intensively explore global issues such as alternative energy, green enterprises, and cultural awareness, as well as political issues such as internal and external military, and ethnic conflicts.



The focus of these selected transferable college courses will be an in-depth investigation of the above subjects using a collaborative approach with intensive student and faculty involvement by way of field trips, guest speakers, research projects, individual portfolio development, and other activities external to the classroom.
