# AVIATION MAINTENANCE

## COURSE INFORMATION

The courses were developed to allow you to gain the knowledge and skills required to obtain your Airframe, Powerplant, or Airframe / Powerplant certification from the Federal Aviation Administration. This certificate opens the door to a career in aviation maintenance.

The FAA requires an individual to be certified as “competent” in both knowledge and skills prior to receiving authorization to take the 9 exams. These exams are written, oral and practical in nature. These exams are independent of Western Iowa Tech. Upon successful completion of the AVM courses at WITCC, you will be issued the required documentation certification which will allow you to complete the 9 FAA exams.

The courses are designed using the Airman Certification Standards (ACS) as fundamental guide for knowledge and skills.

The courses are divided into three segments: General, Airframe, and Powerplant. These segments are further divided onto additional specific topics: There are a total 40 topics covering a total of 1997 ACS requirements. For complete details, see the link to the FAA-ACS noted above.

The aviation maintenance industry considers the Airframe – Powerplant Certificate as a “License to Learn”. This is the first step in a lifetime of learning.

## THE INDUSTRY

There is no doubt that the aviation industry is a key element in the world economy. With over 100,000 commercial flights on an average day, the safe movement of people and cargo by air is essential. Without maintenance, the aviation industry will cease to exist. In a recent survey, industry experts estimated a pilot shortage of 600,000 in the next 10 years, and a shortage of 750,000 maintenance personnel. This estimate covered only commercial operations, and not General Aviation.

## TOOLS

The General portion of the course does not require hand tools, however, at the start of the second semester you will begin the Airframe portion of your training. You will need to have some basic hand tools.

Appendix A: is a list of the tools that you will be needing to complete the WITCC Aviation Maintenance course. You can obtain these tools from the supplier of your choice. Please note that this list DOES NOT MEET what most employers require an A&P to have when they start working for them.

WITCC has made arrangements with two major suppliers of hand tools to the aviation industry. Both offer very substantial discounts to students enrolled in Part 147 schools. Please consult their websites for details on the tool bundles they offer. Note that the prices on the websites do not reflect the student discounts offered.

Both companies have excellent reputations, and warranties. The cost of the tools will be between \$3000 to \$5000 depending on bundle and options. If you are using Financial Aide, this cost can be covered under their programs. Please contact the Aviation Maintenance staff if you have any questions.

## **RESTRICTIONS**

There are some restrictions that you need to be aware of.

- 1) You must be able to Read, Write, and Understand English. This is an FAA requirement.
- 2) The hanger doors are the TSA boundary for the Secure Area. Movement in the Secure area is controlled by the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) and the Transportation Security Administration (TSA).
- 3) The only answer to questions on Alcohol / Drug use is NO. Persons holding a A/P are subject of random urine/blood tests.

Aviation Maintenance is a very rewarding industry; there is a mixture of old school and modern technology. WITCC has designed this AVM Program to prepare you to enter the workforce as a trained, competent, and safe employee. The course in many ways will mimic a typical FBO (Fixed Base Operation) or an MRO (Maintenance, Repair, Overhaul) facility. While aircraft operations are the business, SAFETY is a lifestyle.

There are some unique situations in aviation that require SAFETY to be a primary concern.

## **TEXTBOOKS**

The textbooks are based on FAA publications. There are a number of privately published textbook series available. WITCC will be using the ASA / AMT Series as the primary textbooks for the AVM courses. This series is four textbooks, which will cover all topics for the entire course. These textbooks can be purchased to support courses as needed. General text for semester 1 & 2, Airframe Systems and Airframe Structures (two text) for semesters 2 & 3, and Powerplant for semesters 4 & 5. Total textbook costs should not exceed \$300 for the entire course. The FAA maintains an extensive library of downloadable handbooks and manuals which are free to download. A list of suggested downloads is in Appendix B.
